- I acknowledge the following conditions for receipt of the Guitar Competition prize:
- The handmade baroque guitar is awarded to the winning student (awardee) on the basis of a 5-year free-use term.
 - The instrument remains in possession of the *Santa Cruz Baroque Festival* and is to be returned 5 years after receipt (no later than May 31, 2013), unless other arrangements are made between the awardee and *SCBF*.
 - Upon consideration of the *SCBF* Board of Directors the free-use term may either be extended for another 5 years, or ownership of the instrument can transfer to the awardee, pending demonstration of the instrument's appropriate usage at the end of the initial 5 years.
 - The awardee is responsible for providing adequate insurance for the instrument during this time.
 - During the 5-year usage term the awardee will make at least one musical presentation with the instrument as part of a *SCBF* season concert and in turn *SCBF* will appeal to sponsors to fund in-school demonstrations.

PRIZE INFORMATION:

Baroque Guitar (made by Charles Sutton, Luthier, Santa Cruz)

The instrument offered to the winning soloist of our **Early Music Guitar Competition** was especially made by Santa Cruz luthier **Charles Sutton** in 2007.

It is a **five-course baroque guitar**, based on French instruments of the mid to late 17th century, typical of examples by the Voboam family of instrument makers.



This special instrument is virtually a Santa Cruz "home-grown" product with a redwood top, sides and back of local bay laurel, and a bridge and fretboard of ebony. The soundhole rose is made of gilded paper.
